Leadership and Management

The success of an organization is dependent on its leadership and management. This is the same for both worldly/secular groups and churches/religious organizations.

A *leader* is responsible for leading others, through motivation, collaboration and cooperation.

A *manager* is responsible for planning, organizing, leading and controlling an organization or group of people.



Leadership and Management (cont'd)

Men can lead but not be *in charge* in all situations:

1 Corinthians 12:12-30 (12) Just as a body, though one, has many parts, but all its many parts form one body, so it is with Christ ... (14) Even so the body is not made up of one part but of many ... (20) As it is, there are many parts, but one body ... (21) The eye cannot say to the hand, "I don't need you!" And the head cannot say to the feet, "I don't need you!" (29) Are all apostles? Are all prophets? Are all teachers? Do all work miracles? (30) Do all have gifts of healing? Do all speak in tongues? Do all interpret? (31) Now eagerly desire the greater gifts. {continues with a better way, the "love chapter"}

Men are called to lead – and be in charge - in their home:

Ephesians 5:22-24 Wives, submit yourselves to your own husbands as you do to the Lord. For the husband is the head of the wife as Christ is the head of the church, his body, of which he is the Savior. Now as the church submits to Christ, so also wives should submit to their husbands in everything.



Leadership and Management (cont'd)

Spiritual *leadership* is a sacred stewardship in which a leader serves others and inspires them to fulfill God's purposes. In essence, Christian leadership is leading as Jesus Christ exemplified, putting the needs of others before their desires, leading with love, compassion, and a servant's heart.

Spiritual *management* incorporates spiritual principles and values into the managerial process, aiming to serve God's purposes and treat people as we would like to be treated.

We must make an ongoing conscious effort to be different from the world, because we are constantly surrounded by the world and its emphasis (via Satan, worldly influences, and our fleshly desires).

Key Aspects of Servant-Based Leadership

- **Glorify God in all we do.** Servant leaders serve God by living out the Word of God and advancing the kingdom of God.
 - John 3:30 "He must increase, but I must decrease."
 - Philippians 2:3 "Do nothing out of selfish ambition or conceit."
- Serve others. Servant leaders put others first and act as servants. They listen to their followers' needs, empower them, and help them reach their full potential.
 - Mathew 7:12 "So in everything, do to other what you would have them do to you, for this sums up the Law and the Prophets."
 - Mark 10:45 "For even the Son of Man did not come to be served, but to serve, and to give His life a ransom for many."
- Integrity. A Christian leader's words and deeds must match. Integrity is the hallmark of trust, and leaders who are transparent, honest, and consistent reflect the truth of the Gospel.
 - Proverbs 10:9 "He who walks with integrity walks securely, but he who perverts his ways will become known."
 - James 2:17 "Faith without works is dead."



- **Guidance by the Holy Spirit.** Seeking the Holy Spirit's direction and empowerment to navigate spiritual challenges and make wise choices.
 - John 14:15 "If you love me, keep my commandments."
 - Galatians 5:25-26 "If we live in the Spirit, let us also walk in the Spirit. 26 Let us not become conceited, provoking one another, envying one another."
- Humility. Christian leaders are called to serve without pride, because their authority is not theirs but God's, and it is to be used in service of others.
 - Colossians 3:12 "Therefore, as the elect of God, holy and beloved, put on tender mercies, kindness, humility, meekness, longsuffering ..."
 - Proverbs 26:11-12 "As a dog returns to its vomit, so fools repeat their folly. Do you see a person wise in their own eyes? There is more hope for a fool than for them."
 - Proverbs 18:12 "Before destruction the heart of a man is haughty, And before honor is humility."



- **Living by faith**. Remain faithful in difficult situations.
 - Proverbs 3:5-6 "Trust in the Lord with all your heart, and lean not on your own understanding; In all your ways acknowledge Him, and He shall direct your paths."
 - Ephesians 2:8-9 "For by grace you have been saved through faith. And this is not your own doing; it is the gift of God, not a result of works, so that no one may boast"
 - James 2:17 "Thus also faith by itself, if it does not have works, is dead."
- **Kindness**. Exemplifying the kind nature of Christ as a man to all you encounter.
 - Mathew 7:12 "So in everything, do to other what you would have them do to you, for this sums up the Law and the Prophets."
 - Ephesians 4:32 "Be kind and compassionate to one another, forgiving each other, just as in Christ God forgave you."
- Justice. God is just and we are to make decisions that are fair and backed with integrity.
 - Micah 6:8 "He has shown you, O man, what is good; And what does the Lord require of you but to do justly, to love mercy, and to walk humbly with your God."



• Compassion and Empathy. Servant leaders lead with love and compassion.

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- Romans 12:15 "Rejoice with those who rejoice, and weep with those who weep."
- > Psalms 145:9: "The LORD is good to all; he has compassion on all he has made."
- Wisdom. Christian leaders must use godly wisdom in times of crisis, and they only get this wisdom by immersing themselves in Scripture and praying so that God will specifically answer their questions
 - 1 Kings 3:9 "Give your servant therefore an understanding mind to govern your people, that I may discern between good and evil, for who is able to govern this your great people?"



- **Grace**: Servant leaders use the authority they've been given with grace, showing grace to all.
 - Ephesians 4:29 "Let no corrupt word proceed out of your mouth, but what is good for necessary edification, that it may impart grace to the hearers."
 - 2 Corinthians 12:9–10 "God's grace is always available and sufficient, regardless of circumstances."
 - Ephesians 2:8-9 "For by grace you have been saved through faith, and that not of yourselves; it is the gift of God, not of works, lest anyone should boast."
- **Courage.** Leading as a Christian means being willing to take bold and courageous steps, even into the midst of opposition.
 - Acts 4:13 "Now when they saw the boldness of Peter and John, and perceived that they were uneducated, common men, they were astonished. And they recognized that they had been with Jesus."
 - Isaiah 41:10 "Fear not, for I am with you; Be not dismayed, for I am your God. I will strengthen you, Yes, I will help you, I will uphold you with My righteous right hand."



- **Stewardship.** Christians view themselves as stewards of their faith, responsible for managing their spiritual lives with care and accountability.
 - Peter 4:10 "As each has received a gift, use it to serve one another, as good stewards of God's varied grace."
 - James 4:7 "If anyone, then, knows the good they ought to do and doesn't do it, it is sin for them. "
- **Personal discipline.** Incorporating spiritual practices like prayer, Bible study, fasting, meditation, and serving others into daily life.
 - Hebrews 12:11 "For the moment all discipline seems painful rather than pleasant, but later it yields the peaceful fruit of righteousness to those who have been trained by it.
 - Proverbs 21:31 "The horse is made ready for the day of battle, but the victory belongs to the Lord."



Endurance. Spiritual endurance helps us to thrive in challenging situations.

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- James 1:2-4: "Count it all joy, my brothers, when you meet trials of various kinds, for you know that the testing of your faith produces steadfastness. And let steadfastness have its full effect, that you may be perfect and complete, lacking in nothing."
- Hebrews 12:1-2: "Therefore we also, since we are surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses, let us lay aside every weight, and the sin which so easily ensnares us, and let us run with endurance the race that is set before us, looking unto Jesus, the author and finisher of our faith, who for the joy that was set before Him endured the cross, despising the shame, and has sat down at the right hand of the throne of God."
